Wine routes - Winery Visits

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Binissalem, the town of wines:

Itinerary 1^a: Total duration of the tour: max.9 hours

The region of Binissalem is one of the two wine regions that can use "Denominació d'Origen" on its labels, a state rule that guarantees the origin and the quality of the product. Now there is a total cropped area of about 1.000 acres. From these grapes 80% are used in red and rosé wine and only 20% are used for white wine. The red wine must contain at least 50% of Mallorquin grape "Manto Negro". For the white wine the Mallorquin grape is called "Moll/Prensal Blanc". It is very common to join the Mallorcan grape with the French Cabernet Sauvignon grape. Thanks to the efforts of the wineries, the wine from Mallorca is known world wide. The "Consell regulador" has granted to the Mallorcan wineries the qualification of excellence on various occasions and they continuously strive to improve the quality. We now start the wine route of Binissalem with its most important wineries. On the outskirts of Santa Maria going towards Consell, we find the winery **Macià Batle**. Since 2000 the national guide "Gourmet" has qualified the wine "Macià Batle Blanc de Blanc" as one of the best in Spain. It has 13 degrees, extracted from the Isleño Prensal Blanc/Moll branch, this wine has a fruity aroma. From Santa Maria we go to Santa Eugenia. At the entrance of the town we find the "**Viña Taujana**" winery. Here we suggest the "Negro"(black) year 2001 of the "Moll", a classic white wine. Please do not hesitate to try the table wine that will be served to you direct from the barrel. We leave Santa Eugenia and we go towards Sencelles, on the rural road Camí del Horts we will visit the "**Vins Ca Sa Padrina**" winery. Here the "El Manto Negro" is the only wine that is sold by the bottle. The other vineyard that is in Sencelles is "**Ca'n Ramis**", 50mts from the church, The Serral wine "Can Ramis" year 2001, is a strong wine, that must be accompanied by something to eat, we recommend you try this in the restaurant next door. Between Sencelles and Binissalem, is the farm called "Son Roig", property of the winery "**Antonio Nadal Ros**". Their wine "Tres Uvas" is made from three vines, Manto Negro, Callet and Monstrell. In the typical wine of the region Manto Negro grape we can appreciate the love of Don Antonio. We continue towards Binissalem, town of the wine. In the centre of the town at nº 2 Ramon Llull Rd, we find the "**Vins Nadal**" winery. Here the modern technology merges with the knowledge of hundreds, maybe thousands, of years of traditional wine cultivation. We pay attention to the red wine "Albaflor Crianza" year 2001 settled for only 9 months, it obtains a balanced aroma that invites us to continue tasting. The "Merlot 110" that comes from the Manto Negro grape, contains also the French Merlot grape and reminds us of forest fruits. In the old part of the winery it is well worth, and very interesting, to visit the cellar built of typical Mallorcan stone, called marès. On the outskirts of Binissalem towards Consell we find the most well known representative of the Binissalem vineyard, **José Luis Ferrer**. Very good and well known as "Ferrer" for its reservas and crianzas, the Veritas classic is rich in aroma, do not forget its Cavas. Visiting the bodega is an experience of its own. To finish up we enter Consell and visit the bodega of the Ribas sisters, it is said they have the best vines of Mallorca. The winery of "**Hereus de Ribas**" is a typical mallorcan XVII century farmhouse. The Ribas wines are one of the best wines in Spain and the Cabrera Ribas wine is the best of the winery, soft and with a ruby colour.

Itinerary 2^a: Total duration of the tour: max.5 hours

The region of Binissalem is one of the two wine regions that can use "Denominació d'Origen" on its labels, a state rule that guarantees the origin and the quality of the product. The tour covers the central and western areas of Mallorca. Contrary to the Binissalem area the wineries of Pla I Llevant import the stems to increase the quality, for example the Cabernet Sauvignon or the Chardonnay. We commence our wine tour in Algaida with **"Vins Ca'n Majoral"** The first bottle is a red wine year 2000, the wine "Ca'n Majoral Son Roig", is a blended wine of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah grapes and is left to settle for 12 months in oak barrels from France or western Europe. If you prefer to start with a glass of white wine, we recommend the Blanc Buitbalausí 2000, a young wine with a fruity flavour and a floral aroma, born from a variety of Presal typical grapes. We carry on to Porreres through the Plaça de la Vila, and find nº7 Calle Vileta and the **"Bodega Jaume Mesquida"**. The history of the Mesquida family goes back to the year 1589. During the centuries the family knowledge has improved and the youngest winemaker in the family, also called Jaume Mesquida, is one of the best in the country. Without a doubt you must try the Cabernet Sauvignon year 2000, a wine with a cherry colour, an aromatic character and an elegant body. For many years wines have been cultivated in Felanitx and Manacor. For this reason it is worth going south towards Felanitx and the winery **"Armero y Adrover"**. On calle Camada Reial we find a wide range of white and red wines made from Mallorquin and French grapes. In Manacor we will visit three wineries, starting with **"Vins Toni Gelabert"**. The philosophy of Toni Gelabert is to produce wines with a Mediterranean personality. The Ses Hereves 2000 red wine is a good example of it. Resulting from the mixture of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Syrah grapes, this red wine is not filtered nor clarified. This winery is located in Camí dels Horts de Llodrà. The second winery in Manacor is **"Pere Seda"** at nº22 Calle Cid Campeador. Here you must try the white Chardonnays from the year 2002, and also the Red Mossèn year 2001, two exceptional wines. Lastly in Manacor we will visit the winery **"Miguel Gelabert"**. In the latest international "wine fair", in Madrid, Miguel Gelabert won the first gold medal of Mallorca for the best white wine of Spain, his Chardonnay. But this is not the only wine that is recommended here, you must not go without trying the Gran Vinya Son Caules of year 2000. We finish our tour of Pla I Llevant in Petra at nº26 calle de la Font and the winery **"Miguel Oliver"**. Their wines represent the elite of the island and names such as Ses Ferritges, Original Muskat o Aía are in the wine cellars' of the best wine experts. During this tour we propose a lunch in a local restaurant to try the different wines and the local gastronomy.

Apart from the Binissalem and Pla i Llevant wines that have the mallorcan origin denomination label, there are other wineries in Mallorca. The wineries outside these areas, for example in Inca, Andratx and Alaró also cultivate good flavoured and quality wines. We find this in the Saint winery "**Santa Catarina de Andratx**". Here we have the pleasure of presenting to you the white and rosé wine from year 2002, if you prefer red wine try the Merlot 2000, a fruity wine. The 1997 Gran Reserva is especially fine. The cellar is very modern and impressive, built with the typical Mallorcan stone called Marés. Santa Catarina is located on the Andratx-Capdellà road about 4 kilometres outside Andratx on the left hand side. Next our tour takes us to Alaró to see the "**Castell Miguel**" winery. This winery is young and is managed by its owner from Nurnberg, all the production is sold in Germany. This curiosity does not remove any quality or flavour from its good wines, for example, the red & white Castell Miguel wines of the last two years are exceptional and can be sampled directly in the winery in Alaró. The wine maker Juan Mora has a great responsibility, he is the same man that creates the wines for the winery Ca'n Vidalet in Pollença, another winery with German owners. "Castell Miguel" is on the Lloseta-Inca road about 4 kilometres out of town towards Castellet. Towards Inca on the same road we find the well known "**Son Bordils**" winery. This vineyard is one of the oldest in Mallorca, because, since it was founded in 1433, wine has been produced here, nearly 600 years! We recommend the white wine, the Chardonnay of year 2002, a strong wine with 13% alcohol, also the Muscat from the same year and the mallorcan white "Blanc de Raim Blanc" from the typical Prensal grape. The legend says that the main reason that King Jaime I of Aragon conquered Mallorca, was to liberate the island from the moors to have access to the land that produced the drink of the gods. After testing the wines of the earth, the legend was created. During the tour we propose a lunch at a restaurant in the area to sample various wines and the local gastronomy.
